The Ninilchik Village Tribe is made up of approximately 1,000 members who trace their roots to the Ninilchik tribal lands as well as other Bureau of Indian Affairs-recognized Alaskan Natives and American Indians who have settled in the tribal boundaries and have applied, and been accepted for membership. The governing body of the Ninilchik Village Tribe, the Ninilchik Traditional Council, is presided over by a board of directors of 5 council members elected by the voting tribal membership to 3 year terms. The Council directs executive staff using the Ninilchik Village Tribe's Organic Documents, which are set by the voting tribal membership to exercise tribal operations and tribal sovereignty, as guidelines.



Executive Director's Address



Happy winter!

I hope everyone is enjoying the longer days and increased daylight. As always, I'm anxiously awaiting the wisdom and vision of 'Punxsutawney Phil.' Please, not six more weeks of winter. I want to start by thanking the Council, Tribal Members and staff who made the annual meeting another success. Congratulations to Whitney Schollenberg and Eric Kvasnikoff on their election to the Council. Our annual report was recently mailed out and it's an amazing opportunity to review all the things that we are doing on your behalf. There are many exciting things happening here at the Tribe. We are working diligently on sustainability and new revenue sources to maintain the recent exponential growth of the Tribe. Staff are submitting new grant applications in areas that we haven't pursued in the past. While we have expanded so much over the past

several years with all the additional Covid-19 monies, these funds are no longer available. Please know that we are laboring day and night to do everything we can to maintain the level of services and staffing as we move forward.

Our new NTC Community Clinic in Homer in nearing completion. We should have this up and running by summer. The Anchor Point Clinic is amazing as well, and of course, the Ninilchik Community Clinic is phenomenal. Medical revenues from third party sources are at an all-time high and growing. The team has come together to not only increase billing revenue, but to enhance our patient management system in a way that we can now send notices for annual check-ups. We want to provide excellent care, which includes preventative screenings and appointments to maintain optimal health for our people.

The childcare facility, It Takes A Village, is licensed and up and running. A huge thanks goes out to Chris, Mikylah, Alicia, and their team for working so hard to keep this going and providing a place where our kids can be cared for in an amazing setting. I want to also recognize and thank Pete Cooper for working with the new Fecon mulching machine and getting the roads cleared of brush and alders along the Lake Road and 1200 systems. The lands are so important for our subsistence practices, especially moose hunting. We will be working with Ninilchik Native Association, Inc. on continuing some more work this upcoming season.

Both our new 8(a) company, Tuyan LLC and Nil Qenach'delghesh, our intertribal consortium to provide broadband services to Tribal Members, are continuing. As with any new initiative and business there are ups and downs. The long-term possibilities are endless, and we are working tirelessly to make these important and vital investments pay off for the future of the Tribe.

In closing, I want to recognize and appreciate Shelley Self for her decades of service to NTC. She will be leaving NTC in the near months ahead. It's hard to imagine a future without the partnership and support that she has provided to me in my tenure as Executive Director. She is so respected and appreciated, more than words can describe. We could not have achieved so much without the tireless dedication and unwavering support that she gave to the Tribe for so many years. I feel truly blessed and honored to have been able to work side by side with such an emphatic proponent of the Tribe, helping me in all that I do. Godspeed to her in her journey, knowing that she will be with us in our hearts forever.

Happy 2023 New Year, Ninilchik Tribal Members,

Winter is officially upon us, but folks, we are into the final stretch, with the days getting longer and longer every day now.

The Treasury's Emergency Rental Assistance program was officially closed on September 30th, 2022, this program helped fifty-two families that needed help within our Tribal area. It was a great program that did a lot of good. Unfortunately, we were not able to assist the homeowners with this grant. We are now getting ready to introduce another Treasury program grant, the "Homeowners Assistance Fund" or HAF, as we will be calling it.

We are still working on the details and hope to have this up and running very soon. This program will be open to homeowners of all races within our Tribal Boundary area. The household income must fall within the median income limits for the Kenai Peninsula Borough. We are still working on the program details, but this will be to help mitigate financial hardships associated with the corona virus pandemic by providing funds to eligible entities for the purpose of preventing homeowner mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosures, loss of utilities or home energy services, and displacements of homeowners experiencing financial hardship after January 21, 2020, through qualified expenses related to mortgages and housing. If this sounds like something you would be interested in, please keep an eye on our website.

Next winter looks to be challenging to many of our families who are not prepared. I know we keep hearing about it, but it is time to really start thinking about what you should be doing to be the most prepared that you can be. I think having food through the winter is something we need to work on, and I believe we all need to start learning how to garden again and work toward being self-sufficient for our food. This is an art that many have forgotten how to do, but there are still people around us that know what needs to be done to treat the soil, when to start the seeds, when to get starts

into the ground, best weeding practices, how to store for the winter, etc. I would like to start bringing those lost ways into our future newsletters.



If there are any local Tribal members that would like to share their gardening secrets or food preserving methods that they learned from growing up in our harsh, short-season environment, I would like to start printing them here for people to learn from. If you can help, please reach out to me to get this going.

Getting prepared!

This summer is really a good time to get some weatherization done on your home. This will save that valuable heat from escaping your homes. Download the application on our website or come by the office and pick one up.



The Many Hats of Resource & Environmental

Here at the Resource department, we wear many hats. Most of you know us as the fish guys, but that doesn't even scratch the surface. The Resource and Environmental department is responsible for the community subsistence fishery that assists many individuals incapable of doing so themselves. This program started out with 29 permits to fish for, and in 2022 there were 214. Results of the Kenai Fishery are 2,943 sockeyes harvested in 27 days fished from July 20 through August 15, 2022. Fishing effort was 96.5 hours, averaging 30 fish per hour while the net was in the water.

Sockeye: 2,943 caught, 2,943 harvested. Coho: 58 caught, 58 harvested.

After the fishing season is over, it's a quick change of pace into moose season. The Resource Department does all the permitting for CIRI and NNAI Shareholders to hunt in designated areas. In 2022 there were over 200 permit holders hunting on these properties. Resource is the name; Enforcement is the game. We are out there with the hunters every day during the entire moose hunting season ensuring the well-being of individuals as well as managing the permit system, including permit enforcement.

Starting in October, our team heads out to the woods to do contracted Forestry applications. We have been chipping away at dead-fall and thinning overgrown areas, not only to access areas that have been overgrown for the better part of 20 years, but to create a firebreak. After the Caribou Hills fire, we want to discourage another similar event from occurring. In 2022, NTC acquired a FECON to help streamline the thinning. Areas are open now that we forgot existed!





In 2022, the Resource department started working with Bob Crosby on the HUD rehabilitation projects. Last year we were able to complete two separate HUD projects before the winter snow had begun melting. One home was in Kasilof, and another was located in Homer.

We recently finished a FEMA-approved Tribal Hazard Mitigation Plan. Now that we have a disaster plan in place, we can begin building resilience for the community when funding becomes available.

The Resource department also manages Tribal historic preservation. The Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (or THPO) reviews projects placed forward by the National Reservation Conservation Service. The focus is to ensure that the proposed projects do not infringe upon Ninilchik Villages' cultural history.

Let's not forget we also have BUMPS! Basic Unified Multi Path Services. Providing an affordable means of transportation from Homer all the way to Kenai. BUMPS continues to serve the Kenai Peninsula with direct route transportation service from Homer to Kenai M-W-F weekly. Ridership continues to increase, and it is our hope that we can procure additional funding to expand on these services.

Elders Outreach Program Information

The Elders Outreach Program offers lunch at the Subsistence Building every Monday. The luncheon is typically provided even on holidays that the other NTC offices are closed for. However, please be aware of scheduled closures. The luncheons served at noon coming up for the following months are:

Mondays in **January:** 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd & 30th Mondays in **February:** 6th, 13th, 20th & 27th Mondays in **March:** 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th

The Elders Outreach Program's Luncheon exists to serve as a social space for Enrolled Tribal Elders to gather, share, and visit. Elders are encouraged, if they would like, to bring a guest, family or be accompanied by a caregiver. There is a suggested donation box at the back for this purpose. While it is a provided luncheon for Enrolled Tribal Elders to attend, it also serves many homebound Enrolled Tribal Elders who cannot drive or have other needs that prevent them from attending. The luncheon is also for these Elders, and we ask that all be mindful of others who are not able to attend, as any additional food will be provided and delivered to their homes.

We encourage active participation from the youth and strongly urge Enrolled Tribal Elders to offer their experience, advice, knowledge, and techniques for activities. If you have a cultural/traditional skill you would like to share, please call or email our office. We look forward to the Tribal Elders sharing a bit of their time and knowledge with youth in our area. Our office is open and welcomes your input to make this program grow and thrive.


This past fall, Elders from Ninilchik traveled together to meet with our cousins from other regions and offer their suggestions and input, such as regional and cultural information. A Note From the Tribal Health Director

Policy Updates

We have updated our payment amount for emergency room visits (\$3,000 per year), local dental (\$1,500 per year) and physical therapy (up to six visits with provider authorization). However, because we do not receive ANY IHS funding for Homer, NTC will not pay for any ER or other type services for those patients who live in Homer. You are still required to follow the requirements for these services to qualify. All these policies have eligibility requirements as follows: all the policies state that you must have lived in the Tribal boundaries for at least a year and be an active clinic user within the last year. The ER policy will only be approved if it is something that we are unable to provide at the clinic, you are sent by the clinic, visit to ER is after clinic closure, and is life or limb. Anything alcohol or drug related will not be covered, nor anything that we can provide at the clinic during regular business hours. If you have any ER visits outside of normal business hours, you must notify the front desk or the Tribal Health Director within 72 hours or risk it being denied. Dental through Ninilchik Dentistry must be prior approved by the Tribal Health Director.

Remember to Register

We have a registration platform, **Phreesia**, which I know is not the most popular registration process for people, but it is a great platform for us to gather data. It is also a better registration process and less paperwork, but you will still be required to do the yearly signing and review of your demographic information. For some, insurance, phone numbers, and addresses change regularly



and we do not always get this information, nor do people check this information for accuracy, and this is especially important. Having an emergency contact is also important in case there are any unforeseen events where you are unable to provide any information to emergency responders.

Covid Testing Update

Now that the COVID money is gone, we are now charging \$50 per covid test. These are available by appointment only.

Covid Vaccines are also available by appointment.
